John 1:14 says that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." This is what is commonly called, "The Incarnation." God became a man. This event happened at the First Coming of the Lord; beginning with His birth in Bethlehem. Forty days after Jesus' resurrection, He returned to Heaven where He is now seated at the Father's right hand of Majesty. But, the Word of God reveals and promises that He will return to earth again.
